Town board member, Susan Sutch, reported on the progress of the **Galway Farmer's Market** opening June 28 in the newly constructed community pavilion behind the baseball and soccer fields on Route 147.

The committee has received several applications from vendors who will have products and produce on sale at the market. The market will be a fun community event with food by local organizations, products and produce sold by local farmers and businesses, crafts and entertainment.

The Farmer's Market Committee is now interviewing a **Market Manager** who will oversee operations.

The board has **selected a winning design for the weathervane** that will grace the top of the pavilion. The winning design was chosen from a large number of submissions from the Galway Central School and will be unveiled at the opening. The first three designs chosen will receive awards and all those who submitted will receive a certificate.

May 18 is the official opening of the Stewarts Store on the corner of Route 147 and Route 29, Galway.
